DIGITAL PHOOTOGRAPHY

Overview:

Students will learn how their digital cameras work and how to best use them and the functions their camera is equipped with. Each week the students will get a homework assignment of photographs to take using the knowledge they received in class. They will need to either print or develop these pictures before the next class time.

Target age: $4^{th} - 6^{th}$ grade (students should be comfortable writing key points in their notebooks)

Supplies needed:

Each student <u>MUST</u> have a digital camera (his own or one he can borrow each week). The cameras should have a flash and some menu options (such as resolution, flash options, screen for immediate viewing, and portrait/landscape options). Each student should have a notebook and pencil.
