

100 book challenge

I wanted to challenge my son to tackle a large reading project. At the same time I wanted him to learn to differentiate between fiction and non-fiction books.

We talked about it a bit, and he was on board (especially when I told him he could pick a prize!). I know some people have different feelings about offering prizes, but I didn't see this as a bribe. I saw it as a wage earned for doing lots of work (writing the titles of the books on paper is actually harder for my son than reading the books).

So, we set up our guides, and I let him go! He was very proud of his accomplishment. He worked hard and received a reward. It gave his reading a boost, his handwriting a workout, and taught him the difference between fiction and non-fiction books (and gave us some good discussion about it along the way).

I am sharing the forms here in case you would like to challenge your student to read/log 100 books.
