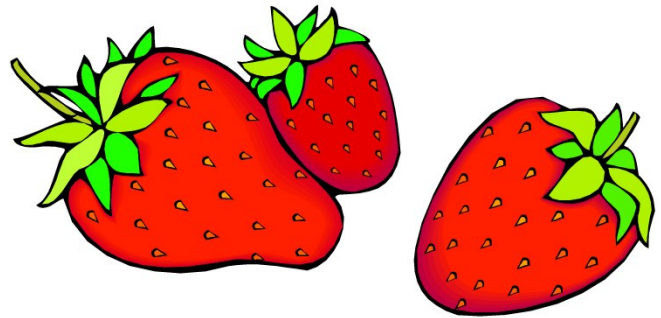
Why do you think the bear likes strawberries so much?

Discuss

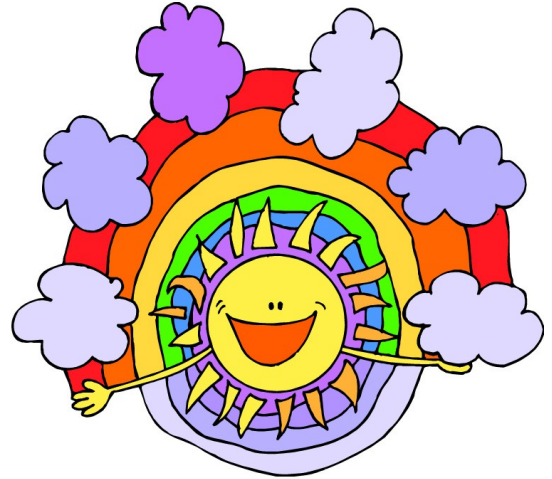
Have you ever seen a rainbow?
