Cut and paste the descriptions to the proper area of the Venn diagram

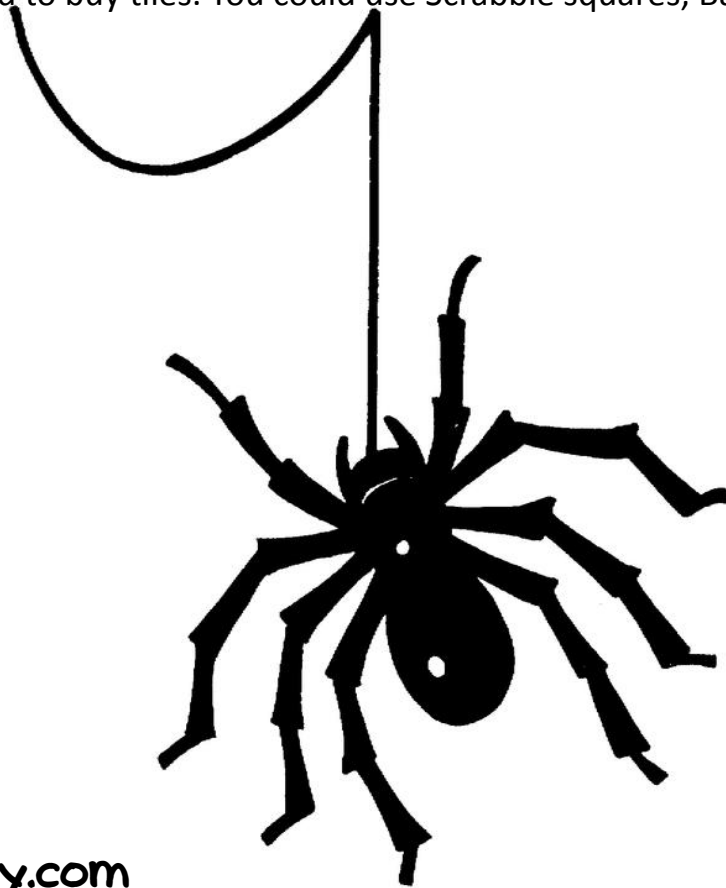
Page 5: Knock-Out! Game

Page 6: Roll A Spider Game

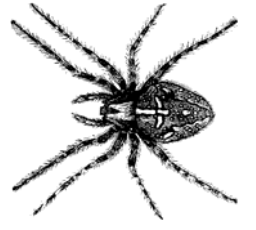
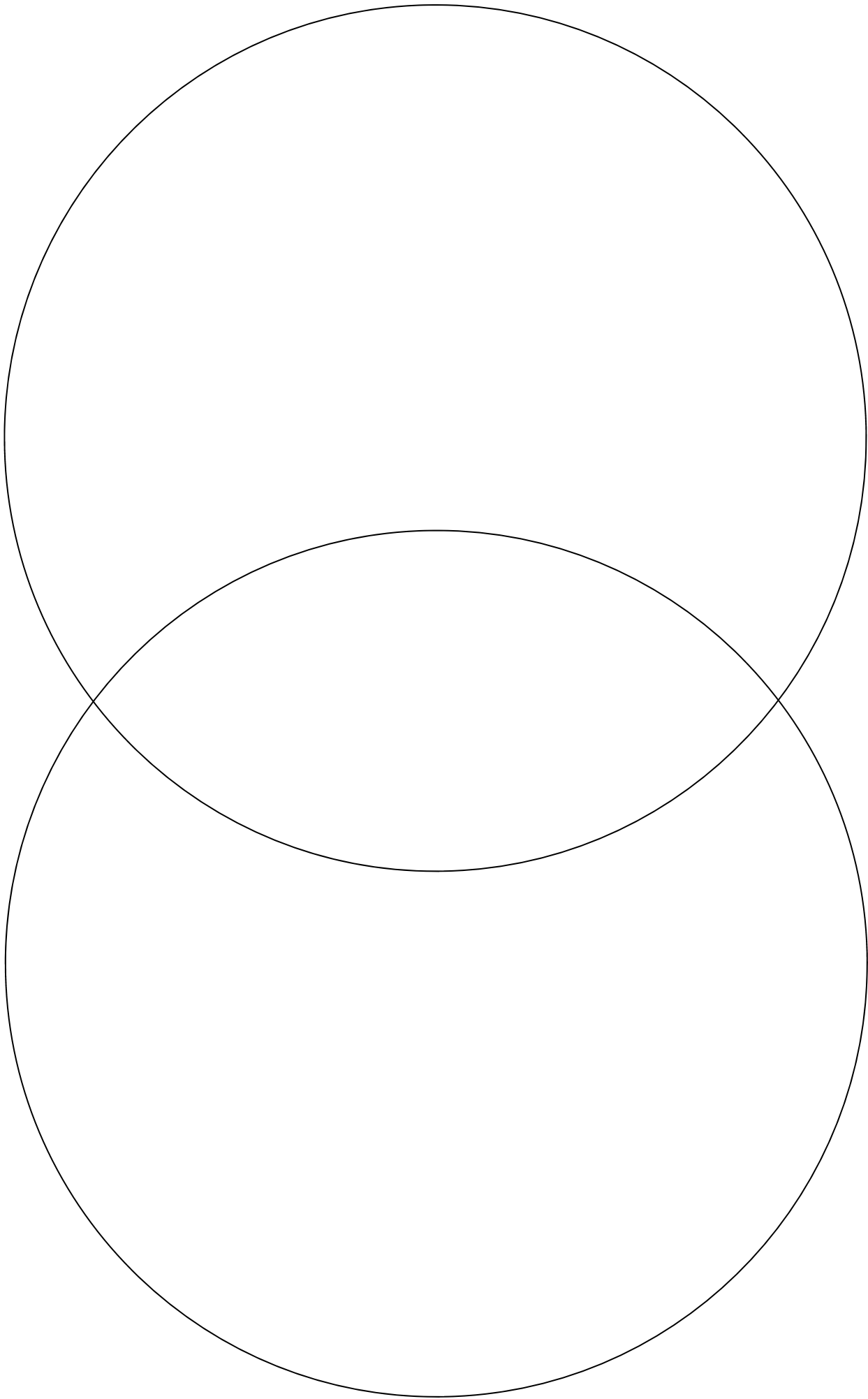
Pages 7-10: Poem and Word Building

	Add 2 legs.



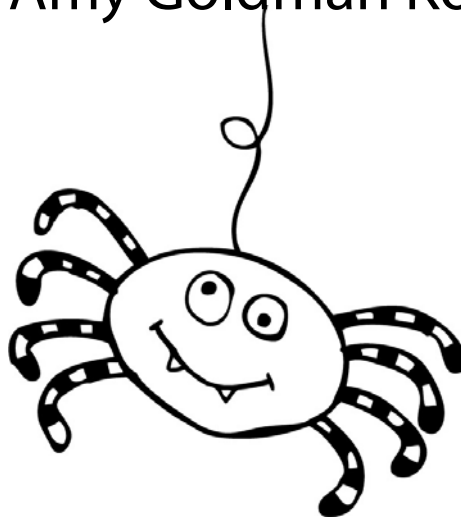
Spider Webs
